What Is Secret Church?

Secret Church began in 2006 at The Church at Brook Hills in Birmingham, Alabama, based on time David Platt spent with brothers and sisters in underground Asian house churches. In those contexts, Christ-followers gather together at the risk of their lives for 8-12 hours at a time—simply to pray, worship, and study God's Word. It's simple, raw, and dangerous . . . all at the same time.

The leadership at Brook Hills began asking if they could do the same thing and decided to try it. They chose a Friday evening where people could gather for six hours for two main purposes: to worship through intensive study of the Word and to identify with our persecuted brothers and sisters by praying intentionally for them. Simply six hours of teaching and prayer.

Approximately 1,000 people participated in the first gathering to study through Secret Church: Survey of the Old Testament and to pray for peoples across Africa. Secret Church continued to grow, and before long, people were driving across the United States to be part of these special gatherings and asking if Secret Church could come to their church.

In 2011, Radical facilitated the first Secret Church simulcast, making it available to churches and small groups across the United States and around the world.

Beyond These Walls

We're glad you've decided to participate in Secret Church. But even if no one showed up, it would still be worth the effort. Actually, this Bible study will hopefully benefit far more people than just those who were in attendance. Here's how ...

AROUND THE WORLD

Most Christ-followers around the world don't have access to seminaries or Bible colleges. In fact, Christ-followers in many parts of the world have no formal Christian teaching at all. As David continues to lead additional Secret Church studies, numerous hours of Bible teaching on various biblical and theological issues are created. Together, the sessions will comprise a portable seminary, so to speak, with mini-courses in biblical training, which are accessible to anyone.

The teaching sessions at each gathering are recorded. Those recordings are then transcribed and translated into many different languages, including Spanish, Mandarin, Hindi, Arabic, and others. The translated versions of Secret Church will be available online as translations are completed.

You are permitted—and encouraged!—to share Secret Church teachings with friends who live in other parts of the world. We also enjoy hearing about the unique ways that short-term teams use Secret Church to train pastors and encourage Christ-followers among the nations.

WHERE YOU ARE

One-On-One Discipleship

Don't let Secret Church be a collection of "fill in the blanks" that exists merely for your own personal growth. Instead, use what you are learning to teach others. Purchase or download an extra study guide and invite a friend to join you as you watch the teaching sessions from a previous gathering and discuss them further. We think the first six Secret Church studies would be good discipleship material to walk through with new believers over a period of several months.

For Small Group Study

Many small groups use Secret Church materials as a weekly curriculum. This gives small group members the opportunity to engage in additional discussion around the topics discussed. We have begun creating Discussion Guides specifically for the purpose of assisting small group leaders in guiding discussion and study within their groups.

Churchwide Gatherings

Some churches use past Secret Church resources to hold gatherings at other times during the year. Some may have Secret Church gatherings once a month to "catch up" on gatherings they've missed. Others choose a topic that is of particular interest to their faith families and invite the entire church to participate. Others may plan a churchwide gathering and then encourage their attenders to go back through the material in a small group setting, utilizing the Secret Church Discussion Guides.

At each Secret Church gathering we take up an offering. All the proceeds will support persecuted Christians worldwide through ongoing ministry initiatives and provide Secret Church Bible teaching materials in multiple languages. Realities In The Present ...

- *The World Christian Encyclopedia* lists nearly <u>10,000</u> distinct religions and para-religions (including various branches, subgroups, and denominations).
 - Of these, 270 have followings of over 500,000 individuals.
 - NOTE: The "nonreligious" are included as a "religious stream" based upon the fact that their belief systems possess characteristics of religions: an unprovable set of beliefs and often a desire to propagate them.
- Christianity ...
 - A monotheistic religion based on the Bible and the life and teachings of Jesus.
 - Includes a multiplicity of traditions and confessions and varying degrees of commitment.
 - Population: Over <u>1.9</u> billion
 - Countries: 206
 - People Groups: 4,082
 - NOTE: For the numbers used here, "people group" refers to an ethno-linguistic group that shares a common self-identity.
 - Unreached People Groups: 1,251
 - NOTE: For the numbers used here, "unreached" refers to people groups among whom there is no indigenous community of evangelical Christians who are able to engage that people through church planting. Technically speaking, the percentage of evangelical Christians in that people group is less than 2%.
- Islam ...
 - A monotheistic religion articulated by the Qur'an and by the teachings and example of Muhammad, who is considered to be the last prophet of God.
 - Population: Over <u>1.7</u> billion
 - Countries: 149
 - People Groups: 2,317
 - Unreached People Groups: 2,121
- Atheism ...
 - $\circ\,$ A belief system which functionally denies the existence of a God or gods.
 - Population: Over <u>1.6</u> billion
 - Countries: 110
 - People Groups: 287
 - Unreached People Groups: 198

- Hinduism ...
 - A conglomeration of religious, philosophical, and cultural ideas characterized by a belief in reincarnation and the pursuit of liberation from the cycle of reincarnation.
 - Population: Over <u>915</u> million
 - Countries: 51
 - People Groups: 1,235
 - Unreached People Groups: 1,115
- Buddhism ...
 - The belief system of those who follow the Buddha, whereby saving oneself comes by following a regimen (path or ritual) marked by meditation and mantras.
 - Population: Over <u>250</u> million
 - Countries: 62
 - People Groups: 354
 - Unreached People Groups: 296
- Animism ...
 - The belief system which claims that non-human entities (animals, plants, inanimate objects) possess a spiritual essence or soul.
 - Includes the belief that there is no separation between the spiritual and physical worlds, and that spirits exist not only in physical objects but also in phenomena such as thunder, wind, and shadows.

Projections For The Future (By 2050) ...

- Overall ...
 - The number of Muslims will nearly <u>equal</u> the number of Christians in the world.
 - The number of Christians is projected to rise at the rate of the world's population (about 35%).
 - The number of Muslims is projected to increase at twice the rate of the world's population (about 73%).
 - Though nonreligious adherents will increase, they will make up a declining share of the world's total population.
 - $\circ\,$ The global Buddhist population will remain approximately the same.
 - Like Christianity, the global Hindu population will increase at the rate of the world's population.
- Factors at work ...
 - Fertility Rates ...
 - The replacement level is 2.1 children per woman (the minimum typically needed to maintain a stable population).
 - The global average is 2.5 children per woman.

- By religions ...
 - Muslims: <u>3.1</u> children per woman
 - Christians: <u>2.7</u> children per woman
 - Hindus: 2.4 children per woman
 - Folk Religions: 1.8 children per woman
 - Nonreligious: 1.7 children per woman
 - Buddhists: 1.6 children per woman

• Age Differences ...

- In 2010, 27% of the world's population was under the age of 15.
 - Christians: 27%
 - Hindus: 30%
 - Muslims: <u>34 %</u>
- In 2010, 11% of the world's population was over the age of 59.
 - Buddhists: 15%
 - Christians: 14%
 - Nonreligious: 13%
 - Folk Religions: 11%

- Conversion Patterns ...
 - Christians are projected to experience the largest net losses.
 - Approximately 40 million people are projected to convert to Christianity.
 - Approximately <u>106</u> million people are projected to leave Christianity.
 - Buddhists are expected to lose approximately 3 million adherents.
- International Migration ...
 - Between 2000-2010, nine countries gained over 1 million international migrants.
 - United States: 8 million
 - Spain: 4.6 million
 - Italy: 2.3 million
 - Saudi Arabia: 2.2 million
 - The United Kingdom: 1.7 million
 - In Europe, the Muslim population is expected to increase from 5.9% to 10.2%. Without migration, the Muslim population would only rise to 8.4%.
 - In North America, the Hindu population is expected to increase from 0.7% to 1.3% (nearly double). Without migration, the Hindu population would remain approximately the same.
- Regions of the world ...
 - Sub-Saharan Africa ...
 - Due to high fertility rates, the population is expected to grow from 12% of the world to <u>20 %</u> of the world.

- High fertility is projected to fuel growth in both Muslim and Christian populations.
- Specifically, the Christian population is projected to double from 517 million to 1.1 billion (from 24% to 38% of the world's Christians).
- In other words, approximately <u>4</u> out of every 10 Christians will live in sub-Saharan Africa.
- Asia-Pacific ...
 - The percentage of the world's population is expected to decrease from 59% to 53%.
 - Although India will continue to have a Hindu majority, by 2050 it is projected to have the world's largest <u>Muslim</u> population (surpassing Indonesia).
 - The Role of China ...
 - One study estimates that the Christian population in China grew at an average annual rate of 7% between 1950 and 2010.
 - If that rate were to continue, over <u>half</u> of China's population would be Christian by 2050.

"Though that scenario may be unlikely, it offers a rough sense of how much difference religious switching in China maximally could have by 2050. Extremely rapid growth of Christianity in China could maintain or, conceivably, even increase Christianity's current numerical advantage as the world's largest religion, and it could significantly accelerate the projected decline by 2050 in the share of the global

population that is religiously unaffiliated."

• Latin America and the Caribbean ...

- Christians are projected to remain the largest religious group (approximately 89% of the population).
- The nonreligious are projected to increase from 8% to 9%.
- Europe …
 - The only region in the world where the total population is projected to <u>decline</u>.
 - The Christian population is projected to decrease by approximately 100 million people (from 553 million to 454 million).
 - Meanwhile, other religions are projected to increase:
 - Nonreligious: About 23%
 - Muslims: About 10% (up from 5.9%)
 - Hindus: About 0.4% (up from 0.2%)
 - Buddhists: About 0.4% (up from 0.2%)
- North America ...
 - Christians are projected to <u>decrease</u> from 78% to 66% of the population.
 - Nonreligious are projected to increase from 16% to 26% of the population.

- The fastest growing religious groups are Muslims and followers of "other religions."
- Unforeseen Events ...
 - War and <u>Conflict</u>.
 - Disease and Famine.
 - Economic <u>Power</u>.
 - Technological Innovation.
 - Political Upheaval.

"For some years now I have been especially struck by accounts I have heard and read of people who have chosen to convert to Islam. Partly these stories are striking because they are so similar—and not only to each other. They are almost always some variant of a story nearly any young person could tell. They generally go something like this: 'I had reached X age (often the twenties or early thirties) and I was in a nightclub and I was drunk and I just thought, "Life must be about more than this".' Almost nothing else in our culture says, 'But of course this is not all.' Instead the voice of our culture just says, 'repeat, repeat.' In the absence of such a voice they search, and they discover Islam. The fact that they land on Islam is a story in itself. Why do these young men and women (very often women) not reach out and find Christianity? Partly it is because most branches of mainstream Christianity have lost the confidence to proselytise."

THE GOSPEL, EVANGELISM, AND CONVERSION

What is The Gospel?

The gospel is the good news that the only true God, the just and gracious Creator of the universe, has looked upon hopelessly sinful men and women and has sent His Son, God in the flesh, to bear His wrath against sin through His substitutionary death on the cross and to show His power over sin and death in the resurrection from the grave so that everyone who turns from their sin and themselves and trusts in Jesus alone as Savior and Lord will be reconciled to God forever.

But now the righteousness of God has been manifested apart from the law, although the Law and the Prophets bear witness to it—the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction: for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, and are justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, whom God put forward as a propitiation by his blood, to be received by faith. This was to show God's righteousness, because in his divine forbearance he had passed over former sins. It was to show his righteousness at the present time, so that he might be just and the justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus. Romans 3:21-26

And you were dead in the trespasses and sins in which you once walked, following the course of this world, following the prince of the power of the air, the spirit that is now at work in the sons of disobedience—among whom we all once lived in the passions of our flesh, carrying out the desires of the body and the mind, and were by nature children of wrath, like the rest of mankind. Paul, a servant of Christ Jesus, called to be an apostle, set apart for the gospel of God … Romans 1:1

O: Offense of Sin

"In any domain, we are unlikely to agree as to what the solution of a problem is, unless we agree as to the nature of the problem. The religions of the world offer an enormous range of solutions to human problems. Some promulgate various forms of religious self-help exercises; some advocate a kind of faithful fatalism; others urge tapping into an impersonal energy or force in the universe; still others claim that mystical experiences are available to those who pursue them, experiences that relativize all evil. One of the critical questions to ask is this: What constitutes the irreducible heart of human problems?" D.A. Carson

 The problem the gospel addresses is humanity's sinful <u>rebellion</u> against God.

Now the serpent was more crafty than any other beast of the field that the LORD God had made. He said to the woman, "Did God actually say, 'You shall not eat of any tree in the garden'?" And the woman said to the serpent, "We may eat of the fruit of the trees in the garden, but God said, 'You shall not eat of the fruit of the tree that is in the midst of the garden, neither shall you touch it, lest you die." But the serpent said to the woman, "You will not surely die. For God knows that when you eat of it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil." So when the woman saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was a delight to the eyes, and that the tree was to be desired to make one wise, she took of its fruit and ate, and she also gave some to her husband who was with her, and he ate. Then the eyes of both were opened, and they knew that they were naked. And they sewed fig leaves together and made themselves loincloths. And they heard the sound of the LORD God walking in the garden in the cool of the day, and the man and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the LORD God among the trees of the garden. For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord. Romans 6:23

 While it is true that the gospel ministers to the consequences of sin in human life, the gospel identifies the rebellion of human sin as the <u>root</u> of our problem.

I was ready to be sought by those who did not ask for me; I was ready to be found by those who did not seek me. I said, "Here I am, here I am," to a nation that was not called by my name. I spread out my hands all the day to a rebellious people, who walk in a way that is not good, following their own devices ... Isaiah 65:1-2

I prayed to the LORD my God and made confession, saying, "O Lord, the great and awesome God, who keeps covenant and steadfast love with those who love him and keep his commandments, we have sinned and done wrong and acted wickedly and rebelled, turning aside from your commandments and rules. But our citizenship is in heaven, and from it we await a Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ, who will transform our lowly body to be like his glorious body, by the power that enables him even to subject all things to himself. Philippians 3:20-21

• <u>Hell</u> is a dreadful reality for everyone who does not believe the gospel.

This is evidence of the righteous judgment of God, that you may be considered worthy of the kingdom of God, for which you are also suffering — since indeed God considers it just to repay with affliction those who afflict you, and to grant relief to you who are afflicted as well as to us, when the Lord Jesus is revealed from heaven with his mighty angels in flaming fire, inflicting vengeance on those who do not know God and on those who do not obey the gospel of our Lord Jesus. They will suffer the punishment of eternal destruction, away from the presence of the Lord and from the glory of his might, when he comes on that day to be glorified in his saints, and to be marveled at among all who have believed, because our testimony to you was believed.

 All who believe the gospel are forgiven, and they stand before God completely justified in His sight, clothed in the very <u>righteousness</u> of Christ.

And because of him you are in Christ Jesus, who became to us wisdom from God, righteousness and sanctification and redemption, so that, as it is written, "Let the one who boasts, boast in the Lord." 1 Corinthians 1:30-31

For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God. 2 Corinthians 5:21

• All who believe the gospel have been reconciled to God.

Through him we have also obtained access by faith into this grace in which we stand, and we rejoice in hope of the glory of God. Not only that, but we rejoice in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, and hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us. For while we were still weak, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly. For one will scarcely die for a righteous person—though perhaps for a good person one would dare even to die—but God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us. Since, therefore, we have now been justified by his blood, much more shall we be saved by him from the wrath of God. For if while we were enemies we were reconciled to God by the death of his Son, much more, now that we are reconciled, shall we be saved by his life. More than that, we also rejoice in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received reconciliation.

Romans 5:2-11

Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come. All this is from God, who through Christ reconciled us to himself and gave us the ministry of reconciliation; that is, in Christ God was reconciling the world to himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and entrusting to us the message of reconciliation. For all who are led by the Spirit of God are sons of God. For you did not receive the spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received the Spirit of adoption as sons, by whom we cry, "Abba! Father!" The Spirit himself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children, then heirs—heirs of God and fellow heirs with Christ, provided we suffer with him in order that we may also be

glorified with him. Romans 8:14-17

• All who believe the gospel now possess the Holy Spirit as a down payment and foretaste of their inheritance in Christ.

In him we have obtained an inheritance, having been predestined according to the purpose of him who works all things according to the counsel of his will, so that we who were the first to hope in Christ might be to the praise of his glory. In him you also, when you heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and believed in him, were sealed with the promised Holy Spirit, who is the guarantee of our inheritance until we acquire possession of it, to the praise of his glory. Ephesians 1:11-14

• All who believe the gospel are a part of the body of Christ, the <u>church</u>.

But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far off have been brought near by the blood of Christ. For he himself is our peace, who has made us both one and has broken down in his flesh the dividing wall of hostility by abolishing the law of commandments expressed in ordinances, that he might create in himself one new man in place of the two, so making peace, and might reconcile us both to God in one body through the cross, thereby killing the hostility. And he came and preached peace to you who were far off and peace to those who were near. For through him we both have access in one Spirit to the Father. What Is Evangelism?

Evangelism is the proclamation of the gospel in the power of the Holy Spirit with the aim of persuading people to repent and believe in Christ.

"But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth." Acts 1:8

• Evangelism always means <u>proclamation</u>, and it always involves communicating the message of the gospel using language the lost can understand.

For "everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved." How then will they call on him in whom they have not believed? And how are they to believe in him of whom they have never heard? And how are they to hear without someone preaching? And how are they to preach unless they are sent? As it is written, "How beautiful are the feet of those who preach the good news!" But they have not all obeyed the gospel. For Isaiah says, "Lord, who has believed what he has heard from us?" So faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the word of Christ. Romans 10:13-17

• Evangelism is proclamation of the <u>gospel</u>. Evangelism involves proclaiming the full message of the holiness and love of God, the sinfulness of every human being, the atoning sacrifice and victorious resurrection of Jesus for our sins, and the necessity of repentance and faith for eternal salvation. For I am not ashamed of the gospel, for it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes, to the Jew first and also to the Greek. For in it the righteousness of God is revealed from faith for faith, as it is written, "The righteous shall live by faith." Romans 1:16-17

• Evangelism is the proclamation of the gospel in the <u>power</u> of the Holy Spirit. We present the gospel message, but only the Holy Spirit can turn a person's heart and mind toward Christ.

But the angel said to him, "Do not be afraid, Zechariah, for your prayer has been heard, and your wife Elizabeth will bear you a son, and you shall call his name John. And you will have joy and gladness, and many will rejoice at his birth, for he will be great before the Lord. And he must not drink wine or strong drink, and he will be filled with the Holy Spirit, even from his mother's womb."

In those days Mary arose and went with haste into the hill country, to a town in Judah, and she entered the house of Zechariah and greeted Elizabeth. And when Elizabeth heard the greeting of Mary, the baby leaped in her womb. And Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit, and she exclaimed with a loud cry, "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb!" Luke 1:39-42

And his father Zechariah was filled with the Holy Spirit and prophesied, saying, "Blessed be the Lord God of Israel, for he has visited and redeemed his people and has raised up a horn of salvation for us in the house of his servant David" Luke 1:67-69

And suddenly there came from heaven a sound like a mighty rushing wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. And divided tongues as of fire appeared to them and rested on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit gave them utterance. Acts 2:2-4

Then Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, said to them, "Rulers of the people and elders …" Acts 4:8

And when they had prayed, the place in which they were gathered together was shaken, and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and continued to speak the word of God with boldness.

Acts 4:31

So Ananias departed and entered the house. And laying his hands on him he said, "Brother Saul, the Lord Jesus who appeared to you on the road by which you came has sent me so that you may regain your sight and be filled with the Holy Spirit." And immediately something like scales fell from his eyes, and he regained his sight. Then he rose and was baptized; and taking food, he was strengthened. For some days he was with the disciples at Damascus. And immediately he proclaimed Jesus in the synagogues, saying, "He is the Son of God."

Acts 9:17-20

But Elymas the magician (for that is the meaning of his name) opposed them, seeking to turn the proconsul away from the faith. But Saul, who was also called Paul, filled with the Holy Spirit, looked intently at him and said, "You son of the devil, you enemy of all righteousness, full of all deceit and villainy, will you not stop making crooked the straight paths of the Lord? And now, behold, the hand of the Lord is upon you, and you will be blind and unable to see the sun for a time." Immediately mist and darkness fell upon him, and he went about seeking people to lead him by the hand.

Acts 13:8-11

"And in the last days it shall be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit on all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams; even on my male servants and female servants in those days I will pour out my Spirit, and they shall prophesy. And I will show wonders in the heavens above and signs on the earth below, blood, and fire, and vapor of smoke; the sun shall be turned to darkness and the moon to blood, before the day of the Lord comes, the great and magnificent day. The sun shall be turned to darkness, and the moon to blood, before the great and awesome day of the LORD comes. For in Mount Zion and in Jerusalem there shall be those who escape, as the LORD has said, and among the survivors shall be those whom the LORD calls." Joel 2:28-32

• Evangelism has the aim of <u>persuading</u> people to repent and believe in Christ. Evangelism is more than mere presentation of the gospel; it is persuasion with the gospel. Evangelism necessarily includes a call for the hearer to repent of sin and believe in Christ. Now when they heard this they were cut to the heart, and said to Peter and the rest of the apostles, "Brothers, what shall we do?" And Peter said to them, "Repent and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. For the promise is for you and for your children and for all who are far off, everyone whom the Lord our God calls to himself." And with many other words he bore witness and continued to exhort them, saying, "Save yourselves from this crooked generation." So those who received his word were baptized, and there were added that day about three thousand souls.

Acts 2:37-41

Recap: What Is Evangelism?

Evangelism is the proclamation of the gospel in the power of the Holy Spirit with the aim of persuading people to repent and believe in Christ.

What Is Conversion?

Conversion is the divinely enabled personal response of individuals to the gospel in which they turn from their sin and themselves (repent) and trust in Jesus as Savior and Lord (believe).

Now after John was arrested, Jesus came into Galilee, proclaiming the gospel of God, and saying, "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand; repent and believe in the gospel." Mark 1:14-15

 Conversion is a <u>divinely</u> enabled response to the gospel. It is not something that fallen sinners can accomplish on their own. According to Scripture, unregenerate people are slaves to sin. They are unable to understand the things of God, unable to obey God or please God, and they are justly under His wrath. They are blinded to the gospel so that they cannot see it. They are not seeking God, but rather running away from Him. They are dead in their sin. Apart from the gracious initiative of God, no one can be saved.

I will take you from the nations and gather you from all the countries and bring you into your own land. I will sprinkle clean water on you, and you shall be clean from all your uncleannesses, and from all your idols I will cleanse you. And I will give you a new heart, and a new spirit I will put within you. And I will remove the heart of stone from your flesh and give you a heart of flesh. And I will put my Spirit within you, and cause you to walk in my statutes and be careful to obey my rules. You shall dwell in the land that I gave to your fathers, and you shall be my people, and I will be your God. And I will deliver you from all your uncleannesses. And I will summon the grain and make it abundant and lay no famine upon you. Ezekiel 36:24-29

"I have heard Ephraim grieving, 'You have disciplined me, and I was disciplined, like an untrained calf; bring me back that I may be restored, for you are the LORD my God.'" Jeremiah 31:18

Restore us to yourself, O LORD, that we may be restored! Renew our days as of old ... Lamentations 5:21

God exalted him at his right hand as Leader and Savior, to give repentance to Israel and forgiveness of sins. Acts 5:31

When they heard these things they fell silent. And they glorified God, saying, "Then to the Gentiles also God has granted repentance that leads to life." Acts 11:18

... correcting his opponents with gentleness. God may perhaps grant them repentance leading to a knowledge of the truth ... 2 Timothy 2:25

And when they arrived and gathered the church together, they declared all that God had done with them, and how he had opened a door of faith to the Gentiles. Acts 14:27

For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast. Ephesians 2:8-9

For it has been granted to you that for the sake of Christ you should not only believe in him but also suffer for his sake ... Philippians 1:29

Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God. Hebrews 12:1-2 ... praising God and having favor with all the people. And the Lord added to their number day by day those who were being saved. Acts 2:47

 Conversion is a divinely enabled <u>response</u> of repentance and faith. The gracious work of God in conversion in no way minimizes or eliminates the necessity and responsibility of sinners to respond to the gospel call. Repentance involves turning away from sin and self. It marks a radical break from a life of rebellion against God. Faith involves not only believing that what the Bible teaches about Jesus is true, but also trusting in Him alone for salvation while entrusting one's life to Him. Repentance and faith are not separate or disconnected actions, but rather two sides of the same response: turning away from a life of rebellion against God in repentance and in the same act turning toward God through faith in Christ. Neither is complete or adequate without the other.

And Peter said to them, "Repent and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit." Acts 2:38

And they said, "Believe in the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved, you and your household." Acts 16:31

 Conversion is a divinely enabled response to the gospel. Indeed, the gospel must be proclaimed for anyone to be converted. No one can be saved apart from receiving, understanding, and believing the gospel. This makes the task of evangelism critically <u>urgent</u>.

For "everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved." How then will they call on him in whom they have not believed? And how are they to believe in him of whom they have never heard? And how are they to hear without someone preaching? And how are they to preach unless they are sent? As it is written, "How beautiful are the feet of those who preach the good news!" Romans 10:13-15

• Further, the <u>content</u> of the gospel message matters. This is especially important in light of distortions of the gospel that are popular around the world. Any gospel message that denies or dilutes the full deity and humanity of Jesus, identifies the human problem as anything else or anything less than our sinful rebellion against God, does not major on the substitutionary death of Jesus and the reality of His bodily resurrection, or does not teach that we are saved by grace alone through faith alone in Christ alone is an unbiblical gospel that does not lead to biblical conversion.

I am astonished that you are so quickly deserting him who called you in the grace of Christ and are turning to a different gospel—not that there is another one, but there are some who trouble you and want to distort the gospel of Christ. Galatians 1:6-7

• Conversion is <u>radical</u>. The Bible uses extreme language to describe it. Someone who has been converted has died to everything they used to be and received new life in Christ. They have, in fact, been crucified with Christ. They have been created all over again. They have been born again. Conversion to Christ is neither casual nor superficial.

Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come. 2 Corinthians 5:17

I have been crucified with Christ. It is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me. And the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me. Galatians 2:20

• Conversion is <u>noticeable</u>. While no believer attains perfection in this life, a converted person is a changed person. This is particularly evident in a Christian's belief in the gospel, love for God's people, and growth in holiness.

Whoever says "I know him" but does not keep his commandments is a liar, and the truth is not in him, but whoever keeps his word, in him truly the love of God is perfected. By this we may know that we are in him: whoever says he abides in him ought to walk in the same way in which he walked. 1 John 2:4-6

• Conversion is <u>permanent</u>. God never lets go of or loses anyone who has been truly converted. While it is true that some may profess faith for a time and then fall away, their very departure from the faith indicates that they were never truly converted. While God alone knows the condition of a person's heart, it is neither biblical nor safe to assume that anyone who has denied the faith, whose life shows no evidence of regeneration, or who has voluntarily abandoned the fellowship of the body of Christ has been converted, whatever they may have said or done in the past.

"My sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they follow me. I give them eternal life, and they will never perish, and no one will snatch them out of my hand. My Father, who has given them to me, is greater than all, and no one is able to snatch them out of the Father's hand. I and the Father are one." John 10:27-30 They went out from us, but they were not of us; for if they had been of us, they would have continued with us. But they went out, that it might become plain that they all are not of us. 1 John 2:19

Recap: What Is Conversion?

Do we not have the right to eat and drink? Do we not have the right to take along a believing wife, as do the other apostles and the brothers of the Lord and Cephas? Or is it only Barnabas and I who have no right to refrain from working for a living? 1 Corinthians 9:4-6

If others share this rightful claim on you, do not we even more? Nevertheless, we have not made use of this right, but we endure anything rather than put an obstacle in the way of the gospel of Christ. 1 Corinthians 9:12

But I have made no use of any of these rights, nor am I writing these things to secure any such provision. For I would rather die than have anyone deprive me of my ground for boasting. 1 Corinthians 9:15

What then is my reward? That in my preaching I may present the gospel free of charge, so as not to make full use of my right in the gospel. 1 Corinthians 9:18

- See the example of Paul ...
 - He had a right to financial support from the church at Corinth.
 - He surrendered this right and rearranged his life for the spread of the gospel in Corinth.
- Hear the exhortation to us ...
 - We have rights where we live and in the world around us ...
 - To life, friends, marriage, family, safety, security, health, and happiness.
 - To eat, drink, watch, wear, read, study, listen to, and say whatever we want.
 - To organize our schedule, spend our time, choose our career, make our money, use our money, take our vacation, and plan our retirement.

- To do what we want to do, go where we want to go, and live how we want to live.
- Christ compels us to <u>surrender</u> our rights and rearrange our lives for the spread of the gospel.

For if I preach the gospel, that gives me no ground for boasting. For necessity is laid upon me. Woe to me if I do not preach the gospel! For if I do this of my own will, I have a reward, but if not of my own will, I am still entrusted with a stewardship. 1 Corinthians 9:16-17

For the love of Christ controls us, because we have concluded this: that one has died for all, therefore all have died; and he died for all, that those who live might no longer live for themselves but for him who for their sake died and was raised. From now on, therefore, we regard no one according to the flesh. Even though we once regarded Christ according to the flesh, we regard him thus no longer. 2 Corinthians 5:14-16

• We are servants of others so that they might be saved ...

For though I am free from all, I have made myself a servant to all, that I might win more of them. To the Jews I became as a Jew, in order to win Jews. To those under the law I became as one under the law (though not being myself under the law) that I might win those under the law. 

Debunking Myths ...

- Animists can only be found in <u>Africa</u>.
 - Animists are found in every region of the world.
- All animists are tribal peoples in villages and jungles who wear weird masks and dance around fires.
 - Animistic thought is often mixed with every religion of the world.
- All animists are <u>primitive</u> people with no education. • Your well-educated next-door neighbor might be animistic.

Who Are Animists?

- Animism comes from the Latin *anima*, which means "<u>soul</u>" or "breath."
- - Objects carry spiritual significance.
 - Events have spiritual causes.

"Animism is 'the belief that personal spiritual beings and impersonal spiritual forces have power over human affairs and that humans, consequently, must discover what beings and forces are impacting them in order to determine future action and, frequently, to manipulate their power." Gailyn Van Rheenen

"Animism is a belief in multiple spirit-beings and souls that inhabit the universe, whose existence is found in people or in nature. As most generally conceptualized such spirits are semi-autonomous beings who represent distinct spheres of influence over nature (such as trees, water, animals, weather, etc.); or locations (such as mountains, depressions, forest glens, etc.); or human beings (that is by causing sickness, inducing possession behavior, evil behavior, or by becoming familial, helping entities, etc.)."

How Do We Share The Gospel With Animists?

Think <u>supernaturally</u>.

Barnabas they called Zeus, and Paul, Hermes, because he was the chief speaker. And the priest of Zeus, whose temple was at the entrance to the city, brought oxen and garlands to the gates and wanted to offer sacrifice with the crowds. But when the apostles Barnabas and Paul heard of it, they tore their garments and rushed out into the crowd, crying out, "Men, why are you doing these things? We also are men, of like nature with you, and we bring you good news, that you should turn from these vain things to a living God, who made the heaven and the earth and the sea and all that is in them. Which is easier, to say to the paralytic, 'Your sins are forgiven,' or to say, 'Rise, take up your bed and walk'? And they woke him and said to him, "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?" And he awoke and rebuked the wind and said to the sea, "Peace! Be still!" And the wind ceased, and there was a great calm. He said to them, "Why are you so afraid? Have you still no faith?" And they were filled with great fear and said to one another, "Who then is this, that even the wind and the sea obey him?"

Mark 4:35-41

The apostles returned to Jesus and told him all that they had done and taught. And he said to them, "Come away by yourselves to a desolate place and rest a while." For many were coming and going, and they had no leisure even to eat. And they went away in the boat to a desolate place by themselves. Now many saw them going and recognized them, and they ran there on foot from all the towns and got there ahead of them. When he went ashore he saw a great crowd, and he had compassion on them, because they were like sheep without a shepherd. And he began to teach them many things. And when it grew late, his disciples came to him and said, "This is a desolate place, and the hour is now late. Send them away to go into the surrounding countryside and villages and buy themselves something to eat." But he answered them, "You give them something to eat." And they said to him, "Shall we go and buy two hundred denarii worth of bread and give it to them to eat?" And he said to them, "How many loaves do you have? Go and see." And when they had found out, they said, "Five, and two fish." Then he commanded them all to sit down in groups on the green grass. So they sat down in groups, by hundreds and by fifties. And taking the five loaves and the two fish he looked up to heaven and said a blessing and broke the loaves and gave them to the disciples to set before the people. And he divided the two fish among them all. And they all ate and were satisfied. And they took up twelve baskets full of broken pieces and of the fish. And those who ate the loaves were five thousand men.

And he saw that they were making headway painfully, for the wind was against them. And about the fourth watch of the night he came to them, walking on the sea. He meant to pass by them ... Mark 6:48

In those days, when again a great crowd had gathered, and they had nothing to eat, he called his disciples to him and said to them, "I have compassion on the crowd, because they have been with me now three days and have nothing to eat. And if I send them away hungry to their homes, they will faint on the way. And some of them have come from far away." And his disciples answered him, "How can one feed these people with bread here in this desolate place?" And he asked them, "How many loaves do you have?" They said, "Seven." And he directed the crowd to sit down on the ground. And he took the seven loaves, and having given thanks, he broke them and gave them to his disciples to set before the people; and they set them before the crowd. And they had a few small fish. And having blessed them, he said that these also should be set before them. And they ate and were satisfied. And they took up the broken pieces left over, seven baskets full. Mark 8:1-8

And seeing in the distance a fig tree in leaf, he went to see if he could find anything on it. When he came to it, he found nothing but leaves, for it was not the season for figs. And he said to it, "May no one ever eat fruit from you again." And his disciples heard it. Mark 11:13-14

• Jesus' power over <u>demons</u>.

"What have you to do with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are — the Holy One of God." But Jesus rebuked him, saying, "Be silent, and come out of him!" And the unclean spirit, convulsing him and crying out with a loud voice, came out of him. And they were all amazed, so that they questioned among themselves, saying, "What is this? A new teaching with authority! He commands even the unclean spirits, and they obey him." Mark 1:24-27

And he healed many who were sick with various diseases, and cast out many demons. And he would not permit the demons to speak, because they knew him. Mark 1:34

And he went throughout all Galilee, preaching in their synagogues and casting out demons. Mark 1:39

And whenever the unclean spirits saw him, they fell down before him and cried out, "You are the Son of God." And he strictly ordered them not to make him known. Mark 3:11-12

They came to the other side of the sea, to the country of the Gerasenes. And when Jesus had stepped out of the boat, immediately there met him out of the tombs a man with an unclean spirit. He lived among the tombs. And no one could bind him anymore, not even with a chain, for he had often been bound with shackles and chains, but he wrenched the chains apart, and he broke the shackles in pieces. No one had the strength to subdue him. Night and day among the tombs and on the mountains he was always crying out and cutting himself with stones. And when he saw Jesus from afar, he ran and fell down before him. And crying out with a loud voice, he said, "What have you to do with me, Jesus, Son of the Most High God? I adjure you by God, do not torment me." For he was saying to him, "Come out of the man, you unclean spirit!" And Jesus asked him, "What is your name?" He replied, "My name is Legion, for we are many." And he begged him earnestly not to send them out of the country. Now a great herd of pigs was feeding there on the hillside, and they begged him, saying, "Send us to the pigs; let us enter them." So he gave them permission. And the unclean spirits came out and entered the pigs; and the herd, numbering about two thousand, rushed down the steep bank into the sea and drowned in the sea. Mark 5:1-13

But immediately a woman whose little daughter had an unclean spirit heard of him and came and fell down at his feet. Now the woman was a Gentile, a Syrophoenician by birth. And she begged him to cast the demon out of her daughter. And he said to her, "Let the children be fed first, for it is not right to take the children's bread and throw it to the dogs." But she answered him, "Yes, Lord; yet even the dogs under the table eat the children's crumbs." And he said to her, "For this statement you may go your way; the demon has left your daughter." And she went home and found the child lying in bed and the demon gone. Mark 7:25-30

And someone from the crowd answered him, "Teacher, I brought my son to you, for he has a spirit that makes him mute. And whenever it seizes him, it throws him down, and he foams and grinds his teeth and becomes rigid. So I asked your disciples to cast it out, and they were not able." And he answered them, "O faithless generation, how long am I to be with you? How long am I to bear with you? Bring him to me." And they brought the boy to him. And when the spirit saw him, immediately it convulsed the boy, and he fell on the ground and rolled about, foaming at the mouth. And Jesus asked his father, "How long has this been happening to him?" And he said, "From childhood. And it has often cast him into fire and into water, to destroy him. But if you can do anything, have compassion on us and help us." And Jesus said to him, "'If you can'! All things are possible for one who believes." Immediately the father of the child cried out and said, "I believe; help my unbelief!" And when Jesus saw that a crowd came running together, he rebuked the unclean spirit, saying to it, "You mute and deaf spirit, I command you, come out of him and never enter him again." And after crying out and convulsing him terribly, it came out, and the boy was like a corpse, so that most of them said, "He is dead." But Jesus took him by the hand and lifted him up, and he arose. And when he had entered the house, his disciples asked him privately, "Why could we not cast it out?" And he said to them, "This kind cannot be driven out by anything but prayer."

Now Simon's mother-in-law lay ill with a fever, and immediately they told him about her. And he came and took her by the hand and lifted her up, and the fever left her, and she began to serve them. That evening at sundown they brought to him all who were sick or oppressed by demons. And the whole city was gathered together at the door. And he healed many who were sick with various diseases, and cast out many demons. And he would not permit the demons to speak, because they knew him. Mark 1:30-34

And a leper came to him, imploring him, and kneeling said to him, "If you will, you can make me clean." Moved with pity, he stretched out his hand and touched him and said to him, "I will; be clean." And immediately the leprosy left him, and he was made clean. Mark 1:40-42

Samsara (Reincarnation)

- Samsara (reincarnation) is the process through which every atman (uncreated, eternal soul) must pass until one reaches moksha (salvation).
- A <u>cyclical</u>, non-linear view of physical life.
 - $\circ\,$ Linear: We're born, we live, and we die.
 - Cyclical: We're born, we live, we die, and we're born again, we live again, and we die again, and on and on ...
- Every atman is trapped in an endless cycle of living and dying and living again in a universe that is perpetually beginning, ending, and beginning again.
 - Past lives determine present lives.
 - Present lives determine future lives.
 - Karma : what goes around comes around.
- Atmans endure suffering through hundreds, thousands, even millions of physical lives before reaching moksha.

Moksha (Salvation)

- Moksha is liberation from samsara.
- Three paths to moksha ...
 - Dharma (the way of _________).
 - The human problem is moral.

- Therefore, dharma is the religious, social, and moral duty that one must observe.
- Varies from person to person and caste to caste.
- Good dharma creates good karma.
- - The human problem is intellectual.
 - One ultimate spiritual reality exists: Brahman.
 - Every atman (soul) is ignorant of Brahman and in need of knowledge that everything (including every atman) is Brahman.
 - We need to see ourselves and the world as the illusions they are, and Brahman as the reality it is.

If I speak in the tongues of men and of angels, but have not love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. And if I have prophetic powers, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have all faith, so as to remove mountains, but have not love, I am nothing. If I give away all I have, and if I deliver up my body to be burned, but have not love, I gain nothing. Love is patient and kind; love does not envy or boast; it is not arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice at wrongdoing, but rejoices with the truth. Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never ends.

As for prophecies, they will pass away; as for tongues, they will cease; as for knowledge, it will pass away. For we know in part and we prophesy in part, but when the perfect comes, the partial will pass away. When I was a child, I spoke like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child. When I became a man, I gave up childish ways. For now we see in a mirror dimly, but then face to face. Now I know in part; then I shall know fully, even as I have been fully known. So now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; but the greatest of these is love.

For the creation was subjected to futility, not willingly, but because of him who subjected it, in hope that the creation itself will be set free from its bondage to corruption and obtain the freedom of the glory of the children of God. For we know that the whole creation has been groaning together in the pains of childbirth until now. And not only the creation, but we ourselves, who have the firstfruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly as we wait eagerly for adoption as sons, the redemption of our bodies. For in this hope we were saved. Now hope that is seen is not hope. For who hopes for what he sees? But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience. Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness. For we do not know what to pray for as we ought, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us with groanings too deep for words. And he who searches hearts knows what is the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God. And we know that for those who love God all things work together for good, for those who are called according to his purpose. Romans 8:18-28

"Is not this the fast that I choose: to loose the bonds of wickedness, to undo the straps of the yoke, to let the oppressed go free, and to break every yoke? Is it not to share your bread with the hungry and bring the homeless poor into your house; when you see the naked, to cover him, and not to hide yourself from your own flesh? Then shall your light break forth like the dawn, and your healing shall spring up speedily; your righteousness shall go before you; the glory of the LORD shall be your rear guard. Then you shall call, and the LORD will answer; you shall cry, and he will say, 'Here I am.' If you take away the yoke from your midst, the pointing of the finger, and speaking wickedness, if you pour yourself out for the hungry and satisfy the desire of the afflicted, then shall your light rise in the darkness and your gloom be as the noonday. And the LORD will guide you continually and satisfy your desire in scorched places and make your bones strong; and you shall be like a watered garden, like a spring of water, whose waters do not fail. He unrolled the scroll and found the place where it was written, "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to the captives and recovering of sight to the blind, to set at liberty those who are oppressed, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor." Luke 4:17-19

And when he returned to Capernaum after some days, it was reported that he was at home. And many were gathered together, so that there was no more room, not even at the door. And he was preaching the word to them. And they came, bringing to him a paralytic carried by four men. And when they could not get near him because of the crowd, they removed the roof above him, and when they had made an opening, they let down the bed on which the paralytic lay. And when Jesus saw their faith, he said to the paralytic, "Son, your sins are forgiven." Now some of the scribes were sitting there, questioning in their hearts, "Why does this man speak like that? He is blaspheming! Who can forgive sins but God alone?" And immediately Jesus, perceiving in his spirit that they thus questioned within themselves, said to them, "Why do you question these things in your hearts? Which is easier, to say to the paralytic, 'Your sins are forgiven,' or to say, 'Rise, take up your bed and walk'? But that you may know that the Son of Man has authority on earth to forgive sins"he said to the paralytic — "I say to you, rise, pick up your bed, and go home." And he rose and immediately picked up his bed and went out before them all, so that they were all amazed and glorified God, saying, "We never saw anything like this!" Mark 2:1-12

 Proclaim the 	promise	of the gospel.

- God has severed the root of suffering on earth.
 - We don't point people to a smiling Buddha sitting on a lotus blossom.
 - We point people to a suffering Christ <u>sacrificed</u>
 on a cross.

Not only that, but we rejoice in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, and hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us. For while we were still weak, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly. For one will scarcely die for a righteous person—though perhaps for a good person one would dare even to die but God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us. Romans 5:3-8

 God has made it possible for us to be <u>satisfied</u> in eternity.

And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, "Behold, the dwelling place of God is with man. He will dwell with them, and they will be his people, and God himself will be with them as their God. He will wipe away every tear from their eyes, and death shall be no more, neither shall there be mourning, nor crying, nor pain anymore, for the former things have passed away." Revelation 21:3-4

• Free from suffering and death.

So we do not lose heart. Though our outer self is wasting away, our inner self is being renewed day by day. For this light momentary affliction is preparing for us an eternal weight of glory beyond all comparison, as we look not to the things that are seen but to the things that are unseen. For the things that are seen are transient, but the things that are unseen are eternal. 2 Corinthians 4:16-18

• Free from all evil desire.

But nothing unclean will ever enter it, nor anyone who does what is detestable or false, but only those who are written in the Lamb's book of life. Revelation 21:27

• Trust the power of the gospel.

Now there was in Joppa a disciple named Tabitha, which, translated, means Dorcas. She was full of good works and acts of charity. In those days she became ill and died, and when they had washed her, they laid her in an upper room. Since Lydda was near Joppa, the disciples, hearing that Peter was there, sent two men to him, urging him, "Please come to us without delay." So Peter rose and went with them. And when he arrived, they took him to the upper room. All the widows stood beside him weeping and showing tunics and other garments that Dorcas made while she was with them. But Peter put them all outside, and knelt down and prayed; and turning to the body he said, "Tabitha, arise." And she opened her eyes, and when she saw Peter she sat up. - All Muslims are <u>Arabs</u>
 - Muslim is a religious term, while Arab is an ethno-linguistic term (i.e., an Arab is a member of a people group that speaks the Arabic language).
- All Muslims are terrorists who <u>hate</u> Americans.
 - Most Muslims are extremely hospitable and friendly ... and many are happy Americans!
- All Muslims hate <u>Jesus</u>.
 o Most Muslims have respect and reverence for Jesus.

Who Are Muslims?

- A Muslim is someone who <u>submits</u> to God based on the teachings of Muhammad.
 - Islam means "submission."
 - Central Islamic creed: "There is no god but Allah and Muhammad is his prophet."
- Muhammad ...
 - $\circ\,$ Born in 570 AD in the Arabian Peninsula (Mecca, Saudi Arabia).
 - Raised by his uncle.
 - $\circ\,$ At 25, married a wealthy widow named Khadija, who was 40 years old.
 - At 40, had a vision of the archangel Gabriel in a cave on Mount Hira near Mecca, where he received a command from God:

"Read in the name of thy Lord who created, who created man of blood coagulated. Read! Thy Lord is the most beneficent, who taught by the pen, taught that what they knew not unto men."

Qur'an 96:1-5

- Began preaching in Mecca as a prophet with a clear message:
 - There is only one God.
 - We are obligated to submit to God's will.
 - NOTE: While Christians worship Jesus as God, Muslims do
 <u>not</u> worship Muhammad as God.
 - A day of judgment is coming when all people will be assessed on whether or not they have obeyed God.
- After the deaths of his wife and uncle, fled to Yathrib from Mecca in 622.
 - His flight, called the *hegira*, marks the beginning of the Islamic calendar.
 - Yathrib was later named Madinat an Nabi (City of the Prophet) and is now commonly known as Medina.
- Married multiple wives and became the religious and political leader of Medina.
- In 630, retook control of Mecca, where he destroyed idols and declared the Kaaba (the main temple in Mecca) to be the most holy shrine in Islam (the place toward which all devout Muslims direct their prayers today).
- United Arabian tribes into a vast army.
- Died in 632.
- Division over Muhammad's successor (caliph) led to a split among Muslims:
 - <u>Sunni</u> (approximately 80% of Muslims today): Believed successors should be chosen by consensus/election (first was Abu Bakr, who was Muhammad's father-in-law).
 - <u>Shiite</u> (approximately 10-15% of Muslims today): Believed successors should be from Muhammad's descendants (first was Muhammad's son-in-law, Ali ben Talib).
- By 732, Islam had spread westward all the way to Spain and eastward all the way to India.
 - By personal conversion.
 - By military coercion.
- Since that time, Islam has been the <u>dominant</u> religion throughout North Africa and the Middle East, Central Asia, and much of Southeast Asia (Indonesia, Malaysia).
- Qur'an ...
 - After Muhammad's death, Muhammad's recitations were written down and collated by Uthman (the third caliph) to form the official Qur'an.
 - An earthly version of a heavenly book.
 - Written in <u>Arabic</u>, the language of Allah.
 - 114 chapters (called surahs), divided into verses (called ayats).
 - About the same length as the New Testament, but ...
 - Not a history.
 - Dictated by _____ human author.
 - A final holy book that <u>supersedes</u> all previous books (which have been corrupted):

- The Tawrat (Torah), given to Moses.
- The Zabur (Psalms), given to David.
- The Injil (Gospel), given to Isa (Jesus).

"We made a covenant of old with the Children of Israel [and] you have nothing of guidance until you observe the Torah and the Gospel."

Qur'an 5:70, 68

• The Qur'an, given to Muhammad.

• Supplemental Teachings ...

- Hadiths, which are traditions, stories, and teachings based on the life of Muhammad that inform and prescribe Islamic belief and practice.
- Shariah, which are legal interpretations of Muslim teachings that prescribe religious and secular duties, including laws and penalties for breaking them.

What Do Muslims Believe?

- Five Pillars ...
 - Shahada: The <u>Confession</u>.
 - To become a Muslim, a person must say and believe this statement:

"There is no god but Allah and Muhammad is his prophet."

- Salat: The Prayers
 - Recitation of prayers five times a day facing Mecca.
 - Salat Al-Fajr: Dawn.
 - Salat Al-Zuhr: Midday.
 - Salat Al-Asr: Afternoon.
 - Salat Al-Maghrib: Sunset.
 - Salah Al-Isha: Evening.
 - Involves repetitions (rakaat) of standing, bowing, prostrating, and sitting before standing again.
 - Preceded by ritual <u>washing</u> of the arms, face, and feet (Wudu).
 - Prompted by a call to prayer (Adhan) in many places around the world.
 - Benefits …
 - Strengthens belief in Allah and submission to him.
 - Brings focus to "the good life" prescribed by Allah through Muhammad.
 - Leads to cleanliness and purity.
 - Builds unity with other Muslims.
 - A prayer service led by an Imam takes place every Friday (Jumaa,

the name for the Muslim holy day) at the <u>mosque</u> (which also includes a sermon from the Imam).

Zakat: The Giving of <u>Alms</u>

Muslims must give at least 2.5 percent of their income to the poor.

- Sawm: The Fast.
 - Takes places during Ramadan, the ninth month of the Islamic calendar, commemorating the month when Muhammad received his first revelation.
 - Muslims fast from sunrise to sunset and then break the fast with a special meal, the "iftar."
- Hajj: The <u>Pilgrimage</u>
 - Every Muslim who is able (physically and financially) must make a pilgrimage to Mecca at least once during his or her lifetime.
 - Each pilgrim walks seven times around the Kaaba, the holiest sight of Islam.
- Six Basic Beliefs ...

"It is not righteousness that ye turn your faces towards East or West; but it is righteousness—to believe in Allah, and the Last Day, and the Angels, and the Book and the Messengers; to spend of your substance, out of love for him; for your kin, for orphans, for the needy, for those who ask, and for the ransom of slaves; to be steadfast in prayer, and practice regular charity."

Qur'an 2:177

• Belief in <u>God</u> (Allah) ...

"I begin with the name of God, the Most Beneficent, the Most Merciful. All praise and thanks are for God, the Lord of the worlds. The Most Beneficent, the Most Merciful. Sovereign of the Day of Recompense. You alone we worship and You alone we ask for help. Guide us to the Straight Path (of Islam), the path of those

You have blessed, not the path of those who have incurred Your wrath nor of those who have gone astray." Surah Al-Fatihah

- NOTE: Allah is the Arabic word/name for God, used by all Arabic speakers, including both Arab Muslims and Arab Christians.
- There is one, unique, incomparable God who does not share His divinity or attributes with anyone or anything else.

"Say, 'He is God, the One. God, to Whom the creatures turn for their needs. He begets not, nor was He begotten, and there is none like Him." Qur'an 112:1-4

The primary sin in Islam is *shirk* (<u>idolatry</u>): the worship of any other god besides Allah.

- Allah has 99 names (attributes or characteristics): 73 in the Qur'an and 23 in the Hadith.
- Belief in <u>Angels</u> ...
 - Angels worship God alone, obey Him, and act according to His commands.
 - The angel Gabriel revealed the Qur'an to Muhammad.
- Belief in the <u>Prophets</u>
 - 25 main prophets amidst a total of 124,000 prophets.

"Say Ye: 'We believe in Allah and the revelation given to us, and to Abraham, Isma'il, Isaac, Jacob and the Tribes, and that given to Moses and Jesus, and that given to (all) Prophets from their Lord: We make no difference between one and another of them: and we submit to Allah."

Qur'an 2:136

Muhammad is the greatest and last of the prophets.

"Muhammad is not the father of any one of your men, but he is the Messenger of God and the last of the prophets ..." Surah 33:40

- Belief in the <u>Holy Books</u> ...
 - 4 prophets brought about the Holy Books: Moses, David, Jesus, and Muhammad.
 - The Qur'an is supreme and final among them.

"Perfect is the Word of your Lord in truth and justice." Qur'an 6:115

"Indeed, We have sent down the Qur'an, and surely We will guard it (from corruption)." Qur'an 15:9

- Belief in Divine _____ Decree ____...
 - God is the Creator of everything.
 - God knows everything, including all that has happened and will happen.
 - God has recorded all that has happened and will happen.
 - Whatever God wills to happen will happen, and whatever God wills not to happen does not happen.
 - Inshallah is a common Muslim phrase that means, "If Allah wills it."
- Belief in Final Judgment ...

"The balance that day will be true (to a nicety). Those whose scale (of good) will be heavy, will prosper. Those whose scale will be light, will find their souls in perdition,

for that they wrongfully treated our signs." Qur'an 7:8-9

"Then those whose balance (of good deeds) is heavy, they will be successful. But those whose balance is light, will be those who have lost their souls; in hell will they abide." Qur'an 23:102-103

- An ultimate day of reward for the faithful that leads to Paradise (Jannah).
- An ultimate day of punishment for the unfaithful that leads to Hellfire (Jahannam).

"For those who reject Allah, is a terrible Penalty: but for those who believe and work righteous deeds, is Forgiveness, and a magnificent Reward." Qur'an 35:7

"The unbelievers among the People of the Book and the pagans shall burn for ever in the fire of Hell. They are the vilest of all creatures." Qur'an 98:1-8

"Whoever goes astray, he himself bears the whole responsibility of wandering." Qur'an 10:109

- An important note:
 - Islam teaches that humans are born spiritually neutral, capable of obeying God's commands, and that they remain this way even after they've sinned.

- Only Allah determines if a Muslim is worthy to enter paradise.

- Other Muslims believe that Jesus was taken down from the cross in a coma and that he later revived and traveled to another area where he finally died.

 - Bridge to cross: "Do you think the Injil contains information that can guide us on the Day of Judgment?"
 - Bridge to cross: "I have read the Injil (Gospel) and I found one verse that is like a light and gives guidance for Judgment Day. Can I share it with you?"
- Trust in <u>God</u>.
 - He is at work.

"Scientific Sam" ...

"After years of self-study in philosophy, religion, and science, I finally came to the conclusion that there are no gods and there have never been any gods. The whole god thing has been nothing more than an invention of humans looking for answers to the fact of existence. As I look back on the whole process I wonder why it took me so long to reach this obvious conclusion. I believe that the acceptance of the fact of evolution was the deciding factor in the conclusion that gods did not and do not exist. Evolution and the natural evil in the world settle the matter for me. There are still questions that science may not be able to answer: I still wonder why there is something instead of nothing; the complexity of life still awes me; I miss the comfort of old legends. But in the end, I prefer the truth instead of lies and falsehoods, however cold the truth may be."1

• "Moral Mark" ...

"Looking back on my youth, I realize that I wanted to belong to the good, true, moral crowd. But what I found out is that it isn't a moral crowd and its teachings are not true. Religions are made up of lies and metaphors to scare their followers into practicing a certain kind of morality. Here's my conclusion: man invented God; man desires power; absolute power corrupts absolutely; man feels guilt, fear, and compassion. These are the tools that are utilized to brainwash the uneducated and weak into believing that they alone are the moral elite. Brainwashed individuals that are infected with religious belief then infect their children, and this perpetuates ignorance and superstition. Religion is just amoral, intellectual slavery. My name is Mark, and I am proud to call myself a moral atheist."¹

• "Insignificant Isabelle" ...

"I am grateful that I believed the stories in the Bible when I was little, because this gave me a calm childhood without any earth-shattering events that made me grow up faster. Once I did grow up, I started studying the natural sciences. Then, after three years of intense studying, it was clear that my eyes were opening wide and that it would be impossible to ever shut them again. After my twentieth birthday, I felt that I had finally grown into my own skin, and all my adolescent insecurities were gone. Now I was ready! Once my fear was gone, everything was easy to accept. First, there is no God. Second, I am an insignificant part of the universe. Third, when I die, I am dead, no ifs, ands, or buts. Fourth, there is no invisible Super-Parent who takes care of me or guides me through life. It was a scary, naked feeling at first, realizing that I am on my own and I better make the best of the one chance at bat

that I have. I found out that there is a heaven, but not your everyday Bible-thumping heaven: my heaven is the circle of trust and comfort I have created with those close to me. Together we walk through life. No crutches are needed and we stroll handin-hand down a short, bumpy road, pausing as often as possible to smell the roses as we gently approach the End."1

But we scientists did not expect to find evidence for an abrupt beginning because we have had, until recently, such extraordinary success in tracing the chain of cause and effect backward in time At this moment it seems as though science will never be able to raise the curtain on the mystery of creation. For the scientist who has lived by his faith in the power of reason, the story ends like a bad dream. He has scaled the mountains of ignorance; he is about to conquer the highest peak; as he pulls himself over the final rock, he is greeted by a band of theologians who have been sitting there for centuries." Robert Jastrow, Founding Director of NASA's Goddard Institute for Space Studies

 - God leaves the imprints of His glory upon the design of the earth.

"Through my scientific work I have come to believe more and more strongly that the physical universe is put together with an ingenuity so astonishing that I cannot accept it merely as a brute fact." Paul Davies, One-time Agnostic

"The design of the universe is very magnificent and shouldn't be taken for granted. In fact, I believe that is why Einstein had so little use for organized religions, although he strikes me as a basically very religious man. He must have looked at what the Christians said about God and felt that they were blaspheming. He had seen much more majesty than they had ever imagined, and they were just not talking about the real thing. My guess is that he simply felt that religions he'd run across did not have proper respect for the author of the universe." Charles Misner, on Albert Einstein

"If we are purely material beings, then we should no more object to mass murder than a river objects to drying up in a drought Our ability to distinguish between good and evil, and to recognize these as real, means that there is a moral standard in the universe that provides the basis for this distinction. And what is the source of that moral standard if not God?" Dinesh D'Souza

• An atheistic worldview provides no objective basis for distinguishing between good and evil.

"The position of the modern evolutionist is that ... morality is a biological adaptation no less than are hands and feet and teeth. Considered as a rationally justifiable set of claims about an objective something, ethics is illusory. I appreciate that when somebody says 'Love thy neighbor as thyself,' they think they are referring above and beyond themselves. Nevertheless, such reference is truly without foundation. Morality is just an aid to survival and reproduction ... and any deeper meaning is illusory." Michael Ruse, Noted Agnostic Philosopher of Science

"We have not been able to show that reason requires the moral point of view, or that all really rational persons should not be individual egoists or classical amoralists. Reason doesn't decide here. The picture I have painted for you is not a pleasant one. Reflection on it depresses me Pure practical reason, even with a good knowledge of the facts, will not take you to morality." Kai Nielsen, Atheist Ethicist at the University of Calgary

 - "If we really aren't insignificant in the whole of creation, then where does that strong desire for significance come from?"
 - "Is there a part of you that desires ultimate justice in the world or transcendent meaning beyond this world? Where do you think that desire comes from?"

Praying For India

You can find a little bit of everything in India. As one of the most spiritual places in the world, India has followers of almost every major religion, including Hindus, Muslims, Christians, and Sikhs. With just over 1.2 billion people, India is incredibly diverse, containing 1,469 distinct people groups and an estimated 200 different languages.

Indians can be found in any number of jobs from street vendors, rickshaw drivers, rural farmers, business executives and everything in between. Often people living in extreme poverty and immaculate wealth can be found in the same city.

Despite this incredible diversity, 80 percent of people in India follow Hinduism, a religion with thousands of gods. For many people, to be truly Indian, one must also be Hindu. Of the over 1,400 people groups in India, 1,245 groups are unreached, meaning less than two percent are evangelical Christian. Of those, 477 people groups, or over 23 million people, have no access to the gospel and no one is currently working to reach them.

For many Christians in India, the decision to follow Christ is costly. Christians make up only 2.2 percent of the population of India. In the 1960s the government began to pass Freedom of Religion Acts, commonly known as anti-conversion laws. A new Hindu government rose to power in 2014 and has tightened laws that discriminate against converts to Christianity and other minority religions, especially those from a Hindu background. In recent years, fundamentalist Hindus have heavily influenced government at the top level.

Open Doors ranks India 17th on the World Watch List for Christian persecution. Becoming a Christian can be a dangerous decision, especially for those from Hindu backgrounds. It is not uncommon for Christians to face societal pressure or beatings because of conversions, and sometimes Christians are killed for their faith. Believers face pressure from the government, radical religious groups, their communities, and often their own families.

Despite these challenges, the church in India remains faithful to Christ and is expanding all over the country. Church leaders are boldly proclaiming the gospel in the face of persecution and have frequent opportunities for training. Believers in India could face tighter restrictions and more persecution in the coming years as the government cracks down on conversions. Indian Christians will need the support of the global church to continue to be bold in their faith no matter the cost.

As we gather together, let us pray for our brothers and sisters who face persecution for their faith in India. Let us ask the Father to continue to grow the church in India and strengthen their faith to make them bold witnesses to Indian people who have yet to hear the gospel.

How To Pray For India

- Choosing to follow Christ in India can often mean facing pressure from families, communities, and the government.
 - **Pray** for new believers in India to find Christian community and support as soon as they choose to follow Christ.
 - Ask for leaders to come alongside new Christians to teach them how to follow Jesus in the midst of persecution.
- Over one billion people in India are unreached with the gospel, and more than 23 million have no access to hear about Jesus.
 - **Pray** for Indian believers to be bold to share the gospel far and wide in India.
 - **Ask** for language and cultural barriers to be broken down and for the gospel to reach those who have yet to hear.
- Lately anti-conversion laws have been tightened in many states, and the government is cracking down on Hindu conversions to Christianity and minority faiths.
 - **Pray** for church leaders to stand strong despite this opposition and for the church in India to continue to grow.
 - **Ask** for those in government to hear the gospel and give their lives to Jesus Christ.
- Materialism has taken the hearts of many in recent years, widening the gap between rich and poor.
 - **Pray** for the rich of India to see that only Jesus can ultimately satisfy them, not their possessions.
 - **Ask** that the poor and marginalized in India would be cared for and would hear of the God who loves them.
